COMMON COUNCIL MEETING  
MARCH 3, 2010  
6:30 P.M.

A regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Shullsburg was held at 6:30 p.m. March 3, 2010 in the Community Room of the Shullsburg Community Townsend Center, 190 N. Judgment Street, Shullsburg, Wisconsin. In the absence of Mayor Tom Curran the meeting was called to order by Council President Dan Spillane. Notice of the meeting was posted and given to the official newspaper. Roll Call- Darrell Morrissey, Carl Ballard, Carol Korn, Dan Spillane. All present. Others present: Wayne Gehrt, Tom Pedley, Tom Lethlean, Richard Reyna, Don Ahlstrom, Dennis Tonak and Deb Lethlean.

Motion by Ballard second by Korn to approve the minutes of the February 15, 2010 special meeting. All aye, motion carried.

Motion by Ballard second by Morrissey to approve the minutes of the February 17, 2010 meeting. All aye, motion carried.

Committee Reports: None

Motion by Morrissey second by Korn to approve the bills for the general, water, sewer, electric, library and pool funds. All aye, motion carried.

Jim Paquette and Harry Lee Blackburn arrived.

Motion by Morrissey second by Ballard to approve the purchase of the pool painting material at a cost of \$4,393.40 from Heiser Hardware in Platteville. All aye, motion carried.

A brief discussion was held regarding the Badger Mine & Museum advertisement for the Shullsburg Visitors Guide. The clerk stated that there is \$200 in the 2010 budget for this advertisement. Motion by Morrissey second by Korn to approve a  $\frac{3}{4}$  page advertisement in the Shullsburg Visitors Guide for the museum at a cost of \$198. All aye, motion carried.

A discussion was held regarding a development agreement between the City of Shullsburg and the Midwest Dairymen. Ald Spillane stated that the attorney is reviewing the agreement. This will be addressed at a future meeting.
